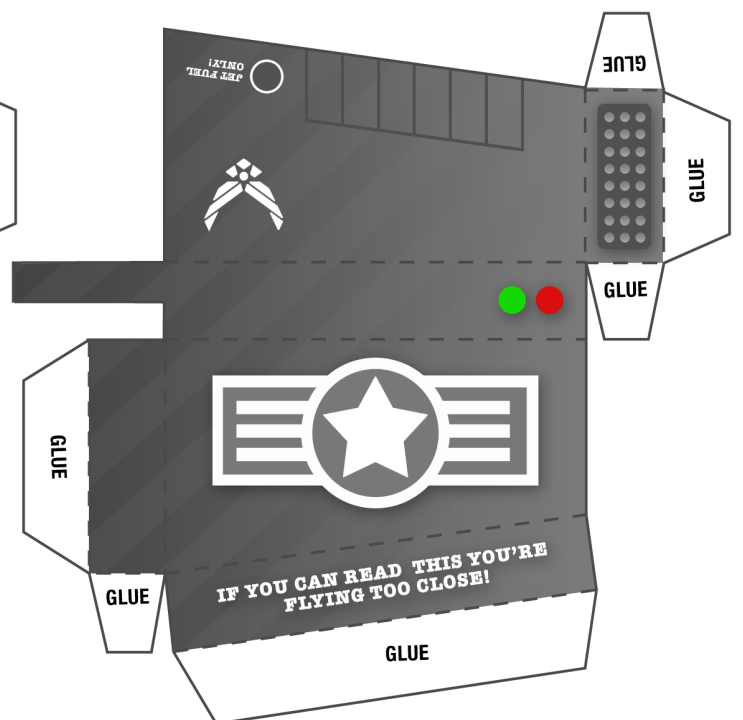
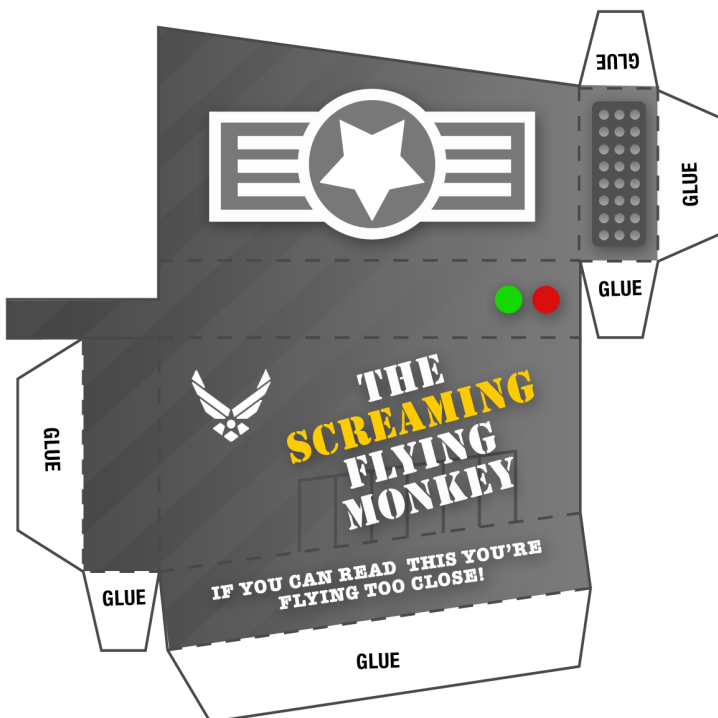

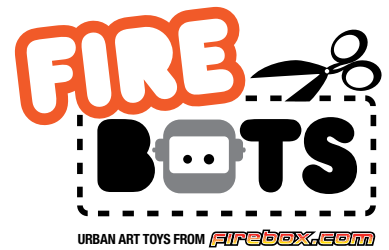
R/C BOT 1 OF 5

If you're a Maverick you'll have already figured how to put this R/C Bot , but here's a few pointers if you're stuck:

1. Cut out all the separate parts and score the dashed lines... it'll make them all fold up real nice. Real nice.
2. Glue each tab on the main body section (the big grey bit, with feet), starting at the bottom leaving the top flap open.
3. Fold and glue the mouth and slide it in side the main body, gluing the top flap closed. Now take a breather, the tough part is over... oh, and the glue needs to dry before you attach the wings.
4. Fold and glue each wing. Take a moment to imagine how cool it would be to have wings, or better yet - be a Transformer! It's a dream, let it go.
5. Now the next bit is a little tricky, so if you're a little guy or girl get your parent or guardian to give you a hand. Insert the long strips of the wings into the body. They may be a little tight so use a scalpel or sharp scissors to widen the slot... careful you don't make them too wide!
6. Finally fold the end of the tongue then twist the long part around your finger so it curls up a little. Remember curly tongues make cooler toys. When you're happy with the curl pop some glue on the tab of the tongue and stick it in R/C Bot's mouth.

You're done! Now not only will your desk will now look super cool, but you can feel good that you've given a FIREBOT a happy home.
